RSS opposes move

BJP KAC toes NC line

The statement of RSS Chief Professor Rajinder Singh quoted by a local daily, rejecting the possibility of an early return of displaced Pandits, has mollified the feelings of BJP-RSS cadres amongst displaced Pandits in Jammu for a while. However speculations about the machinations the BJP Kashmir Affairs Cell headed by Sh K.N.Sahini and Sh Chaman . by NC. Lal Gupta who reportedly are seeking an early return of displaced Pandits more or less as per the plans of ruling National Conference, have not as yet died down.

Internal sources point out a deep alienation amongst the old cadres of BJP-RSS from Kashmir. This alienation is primarily being attributed to the handling of the issue of displacement by BJP Kashmir Affairs Cell. This Cell is being reportedly charged of cultivating an ethnic and caste bias against the Pandits. These cadres view the indirect alliance between BJP and ruling National Conference with suspicion.

In the experience of many RSS-BJP workers [who wanted to remain anonymous], during the internal briefings of the organisation and even direct contact with the leaders of Kashmir Affairs Cell, the issue of internal displacement of Kashmiri Pandits was no longer viewed with priority and sensitivity.

In fact, many of these workers openly admit that this coterie of BJP Kashmir Affairs Cell has similar opinion on the issue of return of displaced Pandits as that of Farooq Abdullah.

The experience of non-BJP activists also substantiate these observations. Last year when a delegation of displaced employees from AG's Deptt. tried to seek help from Sh Sahni on the issue of their forced transfer to Kashmir, they were rebuffed. "If Army can stay their why can't you!" said

Sh. Sahni, as per one of cumbents in the BJP the members of the delegation, Sh Rajinder.

Interestingly, Dr Farooq Abdullah's contention in favour of return of displaced Pandits is almost along similar lines. 'They have to return; if Muslims can fight terrorism why can't Pandits; Pandits have developed a vested interest against return' etc., etc. are the main themes of propaganda against displaced Pandits unleashed

This process had its impact and in fact some Pandit leaders were even bluffed into a dialogue with the Govt. on the issue of return. Aftermath of all this propaganda hype was fatal in the form of massacres in Sangrampura, Gool and Wundhama.

Alarmed by these undercurrents, Kashmir BJP-RSS cadres are trying frantically to send their message across. In the Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha national meet at Delhi recently, Kashmir Unit had openly canvassed for a direct representation to displaced Pandits in the National Forum. In fact, since the displacement of Pandits in 1989 the representation of Kashmiri Pandits in the important organizational fora has been almost nonexistent. This is being primarily attributed to the machinations of BJP Kashmir Affairs Cell.

"After the martyrdom of Sh Tika Lal Taploo then State BJP Vice President and Head of Kashmir Province, Sh A N Vaishnavi, the Sangh Chaalak of Kashmir Vibhag of RSS was forced to join BJP and fill the vacancy, but only temporarily. This was a deft move to force him to submit to the overall leadership of Sh. Chaman Lal Gupta. Vaishnavi ji at that time was emerging as an undisputed leader of displaced Pandits. After curtailing his emergence the Kashmir Affairs Cell unceremoniously shunted him out of the Party hierarchy" observed an old Swayam Sevak.

Interestingly, the new in-

amongst displaced Pandits are hand picked faces unknown to senior RSS-BJP Cadres from Kashmir.

Even these new incumbents into BJP appear to be feeling inconvenient about. the local policy of the Party on the issue of return. Relegation of this sensitive issue to a non-priority in party agenda is putting them into an embarrassing position amongst the displaced Pandits.

According to internal sources, in the recently con-

cluded National Executive meet of BJP on 3rd and 4th May 1998, 4 Resolution were moved by the Kashmir unit of BJP. The Resolutions concerned mainly with geopolitical restructuring of Kashmir where social demography will be relatively positive towards Hindus of Kashmir; economic package for displaced Pandits; granting of minority status to Kashmiri Pandits and announcement of reward to any civilian who kills a militant in the militant infested areas of Jammu province

All the four Resolutions were rejected without any debate. Interestingly, more than 140 amendments to the main resolution were accepted in the National Executive meet.

Intellectual sections of the displaced Pandits are however disturbed more by a different trend in the BJP-RSS circles. They allege that within RSS-BJP circles frequent reference are made to the failures of Nehru-Gandhi ideology. They also allege that disdainful references are also made towards coterie of Kashmiri Pandits Civil Servants who rose to eminence during the Nehru-Gandhi era. "In fact, anti-Nehruvian rhetoric of Sangh Parivaar reflects some times as an anti Kashmiri Pandit attitude. If somebody in Sangh thinks that KPs were responsible for the emergence of Nehru or Indira Gandhi or KPs were the beneficia-

ries of Nehruvian policy, it reflects a gross ignorance of history," said Prof Bansi Lal. He further added that Pandits were the worst victims of Nehruvian model of Nation building.

In a recently concluded meet of old RSS workers from Kashmir on 12th & 13th April 1998, many Swayam Sewaks forthrightly communicated their views to RSS General Secretary, Sh KS Sudarshan. "It's an insult to our dedication and the spirit of RSS ideology if RSS workers develop a sectarian bias against KPs simply because Nehru happened to be a KP," commented an old Swayam Sewak who attended the

Although alarmed by the flirtations of BJP with National Conference and particularly the speculations about BJP toeing NC line on issue of return, Pandit leadership would not like to jump to conclusions and is adopting a wait and watch

"We should not judge BJP by the attitude of a lobby. Statements of Sh Atal ji and Adwani Ji in no way indicate that the BJP is out to accommodate the NC view on the return of displaced," said Dr Ajay Chrungoo, Chairman Political Affairs Committee of Panun Kash-

Even the Kashmiri Muslim representatives in the local BJP have resented the Pro-NC thinking in the Kashmir Affairs Cell on the issue of return. According to reliable sources the fe-

male Muslim representatives from Kashmir in the BJP, openly confronted Sh M L Khurana and cautioned him against any hasty experimentation with displaced Pandits, during his recent visit to the State.

Categoric statement from BJP stalwart, Sh KL Sharma rejecting any possibility of early return of KPs until restoration of complete normalcy, reflects that Kashmir affairs have not been totally left to the discretion of Kashmir Affairs Cell of BJP.

Faced with impending displacements of Hindus from the higher reaches of Rajouri, Poonch, Doda and other parts of Jammu province, the RSS leadership is under a tremendous pressure. Thus, it appears to be taking a different line on the issue of return of displaced Pandits to the inconvenience of many pro-NC sections of local BJP.

Sh. Inderesh Kumar, Prant Pracharak of J&K and Himachal Pradesh stated the policy of RSS on return. He said, "economic package is not the criteria for return of Pandits. Unless the basic issues which lead to the exodus and cleansing of Hindus in Kashmir are addressed, their return is not be possible. RSS cannot allow Pandits to become cannon fodder.'

As conflicting signals keep emanating from different sections of the Sangh Parivaar, the displaced Pandits shall continue to be tossed between hopes and

Puri releases Paper

Serious rift in

Jammu: Serious conflict appears to have surfaced in the Regional Autonomy Committee after its working chairman, Balraj Puri released the Concept Paper on Regional Autonomy to the Press on May 25, 1998. The Concept Paper is supposed to constitute Chapter 1 of the envisaged Report on regional autonomy which is reportedly in its final stages of completion.

The release caused a surprise in the highest echelons of the National Conference leadership. Dr. Farooq Abdullah immediately contacted Mr. Puri and is reported to have sought explanation for this unilateral decision on the part of Sh. Puri. Another important member of the Regional **Autonomy Committee (RAC)** the Finance Minister Mohd. Shafi Uri publicly condemned Mr. Puri for releasing the paper and charged that RAC had not been taken into confidence.

Mr. Puri strongly contested

these allegations and informed that the Concept Paper released by him had been formally adopted by the RAC in its meeting on Oct 25, 1997. When contacted by the Kashmir Sentinel correspondent, Mr. Puri expressed his shock and surprise on the public outburst of Mohd. Shafi Uri. He said, "My experiences of the past are bitter. NC leadership on many occasions has backtracked from its earlier commitments on the issue of regional autonomy. When out of power they support the issue, but when in power they eventually develop cold feet".

Whereas Sh. Puri seems to have taken the incident quite seriously, the office of the RAC appears to be playing it down. The circles within the office hold the view that the conflict has been overplayed by the media. They also seem to believe that such matters only reflect the individual attitudes of some members and would not affect the release of the final report

Mr. Puri seemed to be quite at pains explaining why he was unable to carry other RAC members on the issue with him. He avoided to answer directly the question about the difficulties and opposition faced by him in finalizing the report. Mr. Puri raised many more questions on the issue and commented, "I would like to finalize and submit the report at the earliest. I should not be expected to spend rest of my life in the autonomy committee. I have many more things to do".

NC leadership' reaction and Puri's unilateral moves have put a big question mark on the outcome of the RAC exercise. Speculations are rife that Mr. Puri is preparing ground to quit like his counterpart, Dr. Karan Singh, in the State Autonomy Committee a few months back.

Opposition to the RAC report by known hard-liners in the NC, like Mr. Uri, indicate deep ideological differences within the RAC.

Excerpts of Balraj Puri's statement on concept paper on regional autonomy

....The essence of conceptual framework that the committee has adopted is the widest sharing of political power and equitable criteria for financial allocation and development process among the regions of the state and within regions. The committee firmly believes that a balanced development in the political, economic, cultural and social fields of all the regions and within regions is the surest way to promote integrity and emotional harmony of the state. Much of the emotional energy of the state has been wasted in tensions and allegations regarding lack of equitable treatment meted out to the regions.

...The committee has drawn upon the experiences in the rest of the country as also foreign countries to come to the conclusion that only a federal constitution can unite various kinds of diversities within a democratic system. For this reason, even the erstwhile unitary form of governments are switching over to a federal set.

...As Jammu & Kashmir state is a conspicuous instance of a state that cannot be divided without generating communal troubles and creating other grave implications which can have repercussions in rest of the country, it is a fit case for replacing the present unitary form of con-

stitution by a federal system. Further due to diversities within the regions there is equal need for extending the federal system within the regions also linking it with the three tier Panchayat Raj which has come into vogue in almost all the states of the country. The empowerment of Districts, Blocks and Panchayats would be truly effective only with a similarly political empowerment of regional tier. A five tier system, the committee believes, alone can ensure unity of the state and sense of participation to the people.

...Apart from vertical decentralization of political power, a truly federal and democratic system must also ensure adequate safeguards of the aspirations and interests of non territorial identities which transcend the boundaries of districts and regions. In particular adequate measures should be provided for safe guarding and promotion of their distinct cultures.

... Financial autonomy is an important ingredient of political autonomy. Every unit of democratic system from Panchayat to regions must not only get adequate power for raising resources but the financial allocation by the state should be governed by an objective and equitable formula and should not depend upon arbitrarily, political and subject to considerations.

Political Migrants' racket exposed

Unrelenting attcks on minority in Doda

In its campaign for repeating ethnic-cleansing in the Muslim majority district of Doda, terrorists remain unrelenting in their attacks on the Hindu minority of the district. On May 21, they kidnapped a forest contractor Hari Chand S/O Shiv Lal from his house in Village TIPRI in Thatgru tehsil. He was first brutally tortured and them his dead body was thrown near a Nullah.

In the Kishtwar town in a sensation killing, terrorists gunned down Chaman Lal Shan, a serving Medical Assistant during broad day light. On 19th May, two terrorists fired a volley of shots on him from point blank range outside the main Hospital gate. He was on way to hospital, when terrorists struck. Chaman Lal fell down bleeding profusely, while as usual terrorists managed to escape. Kishtwar became tense after the killing. Apprehending trouble, the authorities immediately clamped down curfew, which remained in force for two days.

Reacting sharply to the campaign of selective killings district BJP leaders Bali Ram Bhagat legislator from Ramban and D.K.Kotwal, state BJP Chief demanding handing over of the district to Army.

Bhagat alleged that the situation in the district was as grave as in the year 1992-93 and demanded use of IAF to destroy hideouts of mercenaries in upper reaches. He warned that the people would be forced to migrate to safer places if timely and effective steps were not taken immediately.

Mr. Bhagat quoted statements of the injured victims from Chirala Village of Thathri to say that the locals actively connived in these selective killings. He alleged that Sajid Hussain alias Tita, Abbas of Amrigarh area, Mushtaq, Amjed, Nissar and Sajad Ahmed of Chirala and three other villagers from Joura in Gandoh as per them were involved. Mr. Bhagat also alleged that militants and some locals have created panic in Kuntwara in Kishtwar and Kandhota in Thathri tehsil in Doda district.

Return of Displaced

ot withstanding the BJP's repeated talk of a proactive approach in Kash mir, the displaced families from Kashmir, Doda, Poonch, Rajouri and Udhampur seem less and less convinced about the possibility of an early return to their homes.

It is not surprising if the displaced would be skeptic about the very intention of the administration to create conducive situation for a viable rehabilitation of the minorities in these vulnerable areas of the state. The displaced have time and again alleged that the entire approach of the state in this context has been primarily of their physical retention. They have also alleged that there is hardly any appreciation of the fact that besides fulfilling a basic prerequisite of maintaining pluralism, the minorities are an extension of the civilizational frontiers of the Indian state.

Pursuing a Nehruvian model based on socialistic concerns, the Indian state failed to develop a civilizational perspective of its strategic and geopolitical concerns. Thus, the state failed to defend its frontiers and rebut aggression from both the northeastern and northwestern frontiers. Nearly a hundred thousand square kilometers of its territory continues to be in illegal possession of both China and Pakistan.

After BJP's takeover in Delhi, expectations have been galore regarding developing a basic civilizational perspective and thus consolidating the nation building process through strengthening a social base of strategic nationalist segments in these frontiers of India. Both Kashmiri Pandits as well as the displaced Hindus of Doda, Rajouri, Poonch and Udhampur in Jammu are such strategic minorities. Their viable long-term rehabilitation in these hostile terrains, where foreign based terrorism is aiming to destroy the civilizational presence of the nationalist pro-India population, acquires a strategic significance. The nation shall pay heavily if its concern would rest only on their coercive physical retention.

It is expected therefore that a BJP government would just not toe a line of its predecessors and seem only to be following a National Conference line on the entire issue. The definitional status of the displaced must be addressed at the earliest to fix the conceptual framework of return and rehabilitation. Deprivations in exile should also be delinked from the issue of return in order to demonstrate the responsibility of the state towards them.

Euphemism on the subject has done tremendous harm. Further dithering on addressing the core-issues which have lead to religious cleansing is bound to fall upon the sovereignty of the Indian state. Long-term measures to reverse the situation are the need of the hour.

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

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Pakistan's grand scheme

akistan continues to suffer from acute identity crisis even after 50 years of its existence. Despite frantic efforts, geographical and historical realities have denied it a leading role in the Muslim world.

The drubbing at the hands of India and finally the bifurcation of the country with the emergence of Bangladesh in 1971 just added to its identity crisis, in spite of the military and economic largesse from the USA and the Arab world.

All these factors led the Pakistani leaders to look for the ways and means to neutralizes India's geo-strategic advantages.

Gradually the Pak strategists developed a 'grand design' to expand its strategic frontiers, by making inroads into Afghanistan and Kashmir. At the same time, Islamabad started contemplating acquisition of nuclear weapons to offset India's conventional military.

The steps considered necessary for creating strategic depth, in order to reduce the geo-strategic vulnerability of Pakistan were:

- Unsettling the Afghan polity to control the balance of power between various factions, so as to weaken the national identity by launching militant groups.
- Waging low intensity conflict in J&K, after gradually subverting the cular Kashmiri culture into a militant Islamic ethos.
- Abetting and arming separatist and fundamentalist groups to wage violent struggle to undermine India's political cohesion; and
- Creation of a nuclear deterrent:
- The events in Afghanistan, after Soviet intervention, sculpted
- As a US front line state, Pakistan was given physical control of arms supply and secret funds, meant for Afghanistan. The Americans also helped Pakistan's ISI in establishing two se-

ist and insurgent cadres. One leaders of the Jamaat-e-Isschool sabotage techniques lami, retired Army Officers and various methods of assassination. The second school trained large groups for cover of operations in Afghanistan and Kashmir.

It also created a power vacuum which Pakistan was able to fill through the Pukhtoon Mujahideen,. Hekmatyar, their chosen leader, failed to deliver a complaint Afghanistan. However, he was the first to suggest a Pakistan- Afghanistan confederation, a concept which later crystallized as the Islamic Confederation of Pakistan, Afghanistan and Kashmir (PAK).

By then Pakistan's psychological war specialists had created several Islamic fundamentalist groups in Kashmir, ready to take up arms at the behest of ISI. According to the original time frame by the year 2000 AD several areas of Kashmir were to be liberated, and a puppet regime established in Kabul.

However, by 1997, it became clear that neither of these two objectives could be achieved in this time frame. Even the Taliban failed to achieve the desired political objectives, despite spectacular military advances.

In Kashmir the proxy war ran into trouble due to lack of popular support and a strong counter action by the Indian Army against the mercenaries.

Afghanistan proved a quagmire, with a destabilizing backlash directly affecting Pakistan. The proliferation of weapons and training of armed groups escalated interaction violence, Shia-Sunni riots turned increasingly lethal, the Mohajir Movement spread violence to large parts of the country, the Pukhtoonistan issue was resurrected and narco-terrorism acquired menacing proportions.

In these circumstances the 'grand design' of 'Greater Pakistan' had to be put on hold. The PAK plans have not, however, been given up, only postponed.

A study of various state-

cret schools to train terror- ments emanating from top and certain media comments, indicates that Pakistan's action plan from 1998 to 2000 may be as under.

- Consolidation of present position in Afghanistan with efforts to establish a Taliban dominated, broad based government acceptable to the global community;
- Intensification of insurgency in J&K by providing heavier weapons to mercenaries, to inflict maximum causalities on the Indian Army;
- Increasing the level of violence in Urban areas in J&K to disrupt normal life with the aim of discrediting the elected government and eventually overthrowing it;
- Indulging in ethnic killings to embarrass the state and central governments; and
- Increasing the flow of funds to separatist and fundamentalist groups in India to escalate violence in various parts of the coun-

India cannot remain a passive spectator to Pakistan's attempts to reshape the geopolitical landscape of the region. India needs to formulate a long-term strategy to counter Pakistan's nefarious designs. India should also make concerted efforts to draw the attention of the international community to Pakistan's continued sponsorship of terrorist and insurgent groups to wage proxy war in neighbouring countries.

Only elected MPs of India and Pakistan can solve Kashmir angle.

International NGOs | concerned about Pandits' plight

Wandhama carnage draws condemnation

Geneva: International Non Governmental Organizations have started taking a strong notice of the suffering of internally displaced Pandits and continued terrorists assaults on them.

In the 54th session of United Nations Commission on Human Rights several NGOs speaking on various aspects of Human Rights violations and rights and protection of minorities, spoke at length about the discrimination against Kashmiri Pandits on the basis of faith and violation of their rights as religious minority. There was also a forceful and outright condemnation of Wandhama massacre.


Geneva based NGO for 'Religious Freedom' was the first to intervene on the Pandit issue, which surprised many. Its representative Mr. Rossi drew the attention of the commission to the violation of most basic human rights namely right to life and expressed surprise that religious minority of Kashmiri Pandits had been left out of the jurisdiction of Indian Minority Commission. He questioned the legal sanction of this

discrimination against the religious minority of Pandits by the Indian Government. Mr. Rossi stated that there was a direct ethno-religious cleansing of the Pandits in their age old habitat of Kashmir.

Even known anti-India NGO namely the International Human Rights Association of American Minorities conveyed its unhappiness on Wundhama massacre.

President of European NGO namely, International Progress Organisation, Prof. Hans Koechler in his intervention drew the attention of the UN High Commissioner on Human Rights on the plight of 300 thousand internally displaced Pandits and appealed to the commission to 'undertake an international investigation on the acts of terrorism in Kashmir and sent fact finding team to the area so as to determine the responsibilities for these acts of ethnic cleansing and geno-

The Asian chapter of African Commission for Health and Human Rights Promoters made the most detailed intervention on the same is-

He was known for ruthlessness and had the reputation of not adhering to any rules or procedures.

Lauther, who had come without his paraphernalia was badly manhandled. Pandits also made fool of Lauther. For nearly two months, the Police failed to locate the Printing press, which published the agitation prop material. Some Pandit youth, who feigned as progovernment informers told Lauther that they could lead him to the Press if he came along. He consented and reached the spot, agreed, near sonal challenge to crush the Rainawari. These youth told

Lauther that the Press was being operated from an island. (Vitaal -where Pandits of Rainawari cremated dead) in Dal Lake. He was pushed into a country boat. After Lauther got down from the boat at VITAAL, Pandit youth left along with the boat. There was terrible commotion in the government circles as State IGP remained missing for as many as six hours.

Lauther also violated all the rules/procedures in appointing and promoting officers. He felt sadistic pleasure in following a policy of pick and choose and favouring his blue-eyed boys. Any handsome young boy in search of Job, visiting his residence would catch his discerning eye and return with the empty cigarette packet with orders for his appointment as sub-Inspector police inscribed on it.

During Lauther's tenure as IGP, one police sub-inspector was promoted directly to the rank of DIG Police within six months of his posting. One Wazir Khan, a Havaldar pro-

moted as SSP. Another Moshar Nath Koul was promoted from SHO to S.P. However, some Pandit Officials, who served during Lauther era felt he was harsh and discriminatory towards them.

There was no one to challenge his decisions. After issuing extra ordinary promotion orders later Lauther would regret over what he had done. He had great sense of history. After Lauther was forced to relinquish his office, he penned down his experiences in Kashmir. This booklet "My madness in a md state" runs into about 80 pages.

Lauther was replaced by another tough British IPS Officer, Mr. Pele, who promulgated 19-L to counter Pandit agitationists. The slogan "Lauther Hai Hai" was replaced by "19-L, Peel's fhail i.e. Boils to Pele " Lauther's "My madness in a mad state" is no longer available to researchers in any library, including India Office Library, London.

Shabir Shah to participate in elections Floats a new Outfit

torious ex- Chief of ISI has asked separatist in Kashmir to widen their operational areas. In a recent interview to a Pak Daily, The News, he said that in the past he had been advising the terrorists to restrict their activities in the Valley.

Other features of the second phase are large scale settling of Afghan mercenaries in POK and then infiltrating them into J&K.

Informed sources have revealed that Pakistan has created a 10000 strong force of mercenaries, drug addicts, convicted criminals, etc. to infiltrate into Kashmir, Alongside this force hundreds of Pak army officers, have been moving in and out of J&K and are coordinating activities of Taliban. Some of these officers were captured by anti Taliban forces in Afghanistan.

Lashkar-i-Toiba, the notorious outfit, currently active in central and Northern parts is the best trained outfit in Kashmir. The real control of the outfit rests with ISI imparted by the Taliban instructors.

In 1993, ISI had shifted operational command from Hizbul Mujahideen to Harkatul-Ansar, when it first started sending international Islamist mercenaries to Kashmir. Now the same has been handed over to the Lashkar. ISI has also helped Jamaat takeover of Hurriat. Hizb supremo Syed Sallahudin alias Yussuf has been given the charge of 13 splinter fundamentalist outfits.

Well placed sources said that nearly 1500 foreign mercenaries have crossed over to J&K while another 1500 have been brought closer to the LOC. Before August, as per sources, ISI aims to push several thousand Lashkars and Pak serving army personnel. Currently, as per intelligence reports 6000 Islamist terrorists are active in Kashmir. Of which 2000 are in Jammu region alone.

Induction of more sophisticated weaponry is also on the ISI agenda. The Home

The training is Ministry of India is seriously worried over reports that a large stockpile of missing Russian nuclear weapons may have passed on to the ISI operatives.

According to Yosuf Bodansky, an international expert on pan-Islamic terrorism, Kashmiri terrorists were in possession of dangerous chemical weapons. He told a select gathering of security experts sometimes back in Delhi that these weapons of the size of an egg have the lethal potential of destroying small towns.

ISI has shifted some of the camps from LOC into Afghanistan, Blochistan and deep into Gilgit. The new camps for specialized commando training to Kashmiri mercenaries have been functioning in Nowsheri, Nowsada, Gaddi Habbi, and Gilgit-Baltistan.

A detailed list of the terrorists camps being run by Pakistani regular army and ISI is also being produced. We shall continue this list in next few issues.

There is certainly misgovernance but there is something more to it. I have told you there are hard-liners within NC. Ab. Ahad Wakil, Shafi Uri, Rather and so many

others are there. Look what they speak on the floor of the house. One of the NC MLA said that they had made a mistake and should have joined Jinnah.

Your party has been talking about ISI infiltration. How do you view state government handling of subversion?

A. Dr. Farooq seems to be helpless. He himself know people. He knows a lot. We also have given him couple of names. He does not seem to act. But we have to understand that between the period of 1990 and 1994 everybody in Kashmir was with militancy. People were in Pakistan and at the same time getting salaries for months. Government is certainly handicapped. From peon to DG everybody is involved. How many people could be thrown out. However, now at least at crucial positions we have persons who do not have any connection with militancy.


Q. There has been division among counter insurgent groups. How do you see the future of your party in the light of this happenings?

Exclusive Interview

We reproduce below the excerpts of Sh. Jagmohan's interview to the Kashmir Sentinel Editor, Sh. Shailendra Aima, where in he talked about his party's thinking on certain fundamental issues concerning Kashmir.

What is BJP's approach on Kashmir after assuming power? How is it different from that of its preedecessors?

The question is of creating an environment. The facts on Kashmir remain the same. Our predecessors were avoiding to face them hard. The entire thing rests on whether you mean business and how quick you respond to a situation. You must have seen that the Home Minister dashed to Prankote in less than 24 hours. We have constituted the National Security Committee and are in the process of revamping the Unified Command. We mean business and would respond with a bullet for bullet approach.

The atmosphere of cynisism and demoralization is being changed. Both the securityy forces and scientists in the country were feeling demoralized because certain decisions were pending for decades. We have changed this environment during last two months.

We have talked about nuclear option and hot pursuits. What are our options after Pakistan's nuclear explosions?

First, it should be specifically clear to all that Indian nuclear tests have not been carried out in response to Pakistan. India is a big nation of more than a billion people and a civilization thousands year old. Our strategic and defence needs are in proportion to these factors. With a nuclear China sitting right on our head, we can't afford a geo-strategic imbalance in the entire south and central Asian context. Then, the five nuclear cartel states can not diictate agenda to a big nation like India, this the world must realize.

As regards the question of Pakistan interference in India and its support to terrorist activities, we shall not allow this and Pakistan has been conveyed the meassage. The option of hot pursuit is always open and we shall exercise it as and

Congress has been in the fore-front alleging an NC-BJP alliance. The local leadership of BJP has denied it but has even asked for Dr. Abdullah's resignation. What is central BJP's approach viz. a viz. National Conference?

We would like the entire nation to cooperate with us on implementing the national agenda. The NC MPs abstained from voting. But there is no alliance between NC and BJP. In fact, there is an alliance between NC and Congress as Congress leader Iftikhar Ansari is a Cabinet Minister in the NC government. Then on several local issues there is an apparent antagonism between BJP and NC. Still, we think that the time has come when the entire nation should be one to challenges before the country. It is good that Dr. Abdullah is keeping his eyes and ears open in the national

The Home Minister of India recently talked about minor-Q. ity cleansing in upper reaches of Jammu. The scenario is grim. How does the BJP intend to reverse this process?

Again it is a matter of approach, commitment and sincerity. As long as terrorism is not crushed with an iron hand and confidence instilled among minorities, the scene shall not show any encouragement. We would like the minority Hindus to return to their native lands. But their rehabilitation has to be worked out keeping in view the entire gamut of the causes of their exodus. It is challenging task and needs utmost sincerity. BJP has demonstrated sensitivity and appreciation and would not allow any compromise with nations' sovereignity and integrity.
